## Town record enjoyed: \$2.75 million fed grant for park along McFee

Town of Farragut has been awarded a Town record \$2,750,000 grant that will be used to develop park property, which was purchased in 2023, according to a Town press release.

"The Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant, managed locally by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, was a 50 percent match of the total purchase price of the property," the release stated.

"The 70-acre parcel, which includes 15 acres of donated land, is on the west side of McFee Road near the junction with Boyd Station Road," the release added. "The grant requires that construction of recreational facilities must begin by 2027.

"Farragut Parks & Recreation Department will be soliciting extensive community feedback on desired amenities for the new park," it further stated.

The FLWCF Grant program is a nationwide competitive grant cycle, according to the press release.

"Funds can be used for land acquisition, indoor and outdoor recreation facilities and trail development," the release stated.





## Tops in '24 Farragut, personal honors; big snow

Town of Farragut was honored in a handful of ways in 2024, including one "best in state" ranking.

Niche, an online platform for connecting people to their future schools, neighborhoods and workplaces, ranked Farragut as No. 1 in "Best Suburbs for Buying a House in Tennessee.'

The ranking is based on reviews, survey responses and public data sources, including the Department of Education, U.S. Census and FBI.

### Tree City USA

Town of Farragut staff's efforts to care for and preserve Town trees was recognized when it earned a Tree City USA designation by national Arbor Day Foundation to honor its commitment to effective urban forest management.

"We waited a long time for this," Town Community Development director Mark Shipley said last April. "We worked hard, and finally in February ... the Town of Farragut was awarded Tree City designation by the Arbor Day Foundation.'

He added the Town is one of 3,600 communities nationwide to receive that designation.

### Courtney's many honors

Former Farragut School football head coach Eddie Courtney racked up the honors in 2024.

For starters, Courtney head coach of the Ads for 28 seasons, winning the 2016 Class 5A state title while and coaching/teaching at the school for 45 years named to the 2024 Class of Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame inductees in July; he also was honored with having the FHS entrance-exit drive from North Campbell Station Road named Eddie Courtney Lane last summer.

And to top it all off, the FHS football stadium was named in his honor (see photo) Sept. 28.



### Tops in '24 **Farragut growth** from Center to southwest side; lawsuit, EZ Stop, pickleball, K-5th

While Farragut Town Center looked like a typical large construction site early in 2024 (see photo, right), it blossomed into a series of business locations, a handful filled, plus an apartment complex on the site's southeastern side that already has a few residents.

Meanwhile, the Town's southwestern side along Kingston Pike saw major construction and growth in 2024 with the construction-turnedopening of a second Dollar General store location and Advance Auto Parts, with a Dunkin Donuts location still under construction.

The new shopping center at the corner of North Watt Road and Kingston Pike will have Publix as its anchor, as crews already have constructed the center's parking lot.

Well under way in this same area is construction of Knoxville Temple for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

As for Town growth along Outlet Drive, an Echo Suites hotel is being proposed near Topgolf, subject to the details being ironed out between Farragut Municipal Planning Commission and Town's Board of Mayor and Aldermen.

### **Growth Plan reversal**

And speaking of growth in terms of a countywide Growth Plan update, which had to be approved by all three county entities: Town of Farragut, City of Knoxville and Knox County to be implemented, BOMA voted, on first reading, against the update, with North Ward Alderman Scott Meyer joining South Ward Aldermen David White and Drew Burnette in voting no.

However, Meyer had a change of heart on second reading, joining Mayor Ron Williams and then Vice Mayor Louise Povlin in favor of the update, allowing it to be enacted — with the city and county already on board.

### Greenway block

To avoid having a Turkey Creek Greenway extension path running through the property of three homes along Turkey Creek Road, these residents fought Town efforts strong enough to hire Knoxville attorney John Neal to fighting this legally.

Neal said he filed a lawsuit against the Town to block the greenway path, stating that a new state law passed April 24,



2024, "prohibits the condemnation of private property for 'recreational facilities, recreational purposes or parks.

"... Suddenly, the Turkey Creed Greenway extension was no longer a greenway project (in name)," Neal further stated.

### Pickleball decision

After months of deliberation on the exact plan for the Mayor Bob Leonard Park pickleball facility, it was decided by BOMA late in the year to go with a plan featuring nine courts in the park's western

next to historic Old Concord,

approval from Knox County Planning Commission for the company's plan was, on appeal to Knox County Board of Zoning Appeals, a reversal ruling demanding EZ Stop reduce its size plans.

However, at a Knox County Use on Review Planning meeting Dec. 12, upon hearing the EZ Stop proposal, voted to approve the plans with seven pumps, or 14 points of sale. OCRA could again appeal to the Zoning board at its Feb. 20 meeting.

Complete installation of the Town's Advance Traffic Signal Conrol system — which is expected to significantly reduce traffic congestion in Town by being able to time redlights according to traffic at any given moment — was said to be "five months behind," as told by Town administrator David Smoak in mid-December.

New school: K-fifth-grade

Following a survey targeting parents, teachers, administrators and the general public in Farragut, combined with Knox County administrative

# Tops in '24 Hardships, turmoil, yet Helene Town relief

In terms of the darker side of Farragut and local news in 2024, a dead body was discovered in a pond at Willow Creek Golf Club, two anonymous threats were made targeting Hardin Valley Middle School, causing two evacuations with a minor charged for one of the threats — and the winter weather destruction of a Dock D metal roof at Sun Life Concord Marina (see photo, above right).

### Hurricane relief effort

However, in terms of how Town of Farragut responded to Hurricane Helene victims in northeast Tennessee, a huge bottled water relief effort kicked off and culminated Friday, Oct. 4, in the parking lot of Faith Promise Church, West End Avenue.

From Alex Cain, newly

elected Town of Farragut

Alderman in 2024 representing the North Ward, to Knox County Mayor Glenn "Kane' Jacobs — with help from Town officials — Farragut and the county each contributed big-

time with water bottle drives to help these victims.

While Jacobs helped lead the county's effort in a Knoxville-based water drive Saturday, Oct. 5, from the Town side of things came a water donation drive spearheaded by Cain and Town administrator David Smoak — along with help from several Town employees and at least one local business — in the parking lot of Faith Promise Church, West End Avenue, from early morning to early afternoon, Friday, Oct. 4.

The result, according to Cain, was roughly 12,000 cases (each case having from 40 to 48 bottles ranging from 16 to 20 ounces) collected, which was "two full dump trucks plus a Town of Farragut pickup truck equivalent of water collected today. ... And that doesn't count three extra vans full" from Protech Automotive Solutions/Caliber Collision.

As for what prompted the Town's response, "Monday, (a radio station) and The Sports Animal (radio), they were doing a supply drive at their radio station, and they had a company bring them a semitruck trailer; their goal was to fill the trailer," Cain said.

"... I reached out to David Smoak and to (Town Mayor) Ron Williams. I sent an e-mail out to all the aldermen and everybody and said, 'Hey, can we, as a Town, do something like this?' Then David Smoak ran with it after that. He coordinated."



Pieces of scattered green roofing can still be seen days after the collapse of the metal roof on D Dock at Sun Life Concord Marina on Fort Loudoun Lake from heavy snowfall Monday, Jan. 16. While work continued to clean up the dock, "We're relieved to report that nobody was injured," stated Ric Cheyney, chief of marine operations for Sun Life, in a press release. "Safety is, and will remain, our number one priority. ... Our dedicated crews continue their efforts to clean up and remove the damaged dock section ... and enhance overall safety stability." Marina manager James Bisch said that while some boats were damaged, none sunk. No dollar amount of damage was estimated.

# Lions reinvigorated in 2024; TSSAA ready?


Is Concord Christian School high school football ready to face the rigors of TSSAA private school competition for 10 weeks in 2025?

After getting a taste of such competition in the fall of 2024, the Lions went 3-2 against varsity-level competition, which included a team from Hayesville, North Carolina during the program's first-ever home game on a rainy Saturday, Sept. 28 (a 37-16 loss).

To compete in the Division II-A East Region, with head coach Steve Matthews having revived the program that played two seasons of TSSAA II-A without winning in 2017 and 2018 — sometimes taking a tough beating — "I thought it was really good for us," Matthews said about the five-game varsity schedule tune-up in 2024.

Having begun playing junior varsity teams the first five week before finishing against varsity foes, "I thought that was a good way to set it up," Matthews said. "We've got several guys on the team that hadn't really played a whole lot of football."

The Lions will play six region games: Webb School-Bell Buckle (Sept. 12), Providence Academy (Oct. 3) and Providence Christian (Oct. 24) all at home, and Middle Tennessee Christian School (Sept. 19), The Kings Academy (Sept. 26) and Chattanooga Grace (Oct. 31) on the road.






# Christmas Cookie Sale

Concord United Methodist Church's United Women in Faith hosted its Christmas Cookie Sale, which started after church services at 9:30 a.m. until they ran out of cookies, Sunday, Dec. 22, in the Fellowship Hall of the church, 11020 Roane Drive.

"We do this cookie sale every year," said Becky Bishop, UWF president. "Our Mom's Group started it, and every penny we raise goes to local missions." Bishop thought there were about 50 dozen cookies made by church members for the event, and she expected more to come.

"By 11 a.m., they will all be gone," she added.

The UWF also sells pecans and apple butter. "We bought 14 cases of pecans," many of which were sold during a fall craft sale (in November)," Bishop said. "We have two cases — 39 pounds — left (from the craft sale). We buy these pecans every year fresh, just picked and shelled, from Georgia. We get them the third week in November."

CUMC missions director Jane Currin and a missions group make the apple butter at Camp Dickenson in Virginia in November, starting at 7 a.m. and using kettles outside to make the apple butter.

UWF is a mission-driven ministry focusing on women and children. "We've been around for about 50 years," Bishop said.


