Camp Big Fish is again casting a wide net for "little fish" yearning for a fun-filled summer.

The faith-based day camp currently has openings for youngsters at its Knoxville Christian School location off Snyder Road, just outside of Farragut, beginning Tuesday, June 1.

Owners Jeremy and Molly Deitch have 10 weeks of jam-packed activities planned, including field trips to The Muse, Zoo Knoxville, Main Event and Cool Sports, weekly swimming excursions, theme days and lots of outdoor games.

While their stated mission is "for all involved to have a safe and fun experience that leads children and families to grow in their faith in God," having fun is high on the list, too.

"We think kids need camp now, more than anything else," said Jeremy. "And everything we do goes into making our camps 100 percent fun. We are planning theme days, dress up days, Color Wars—many activities for the kids to get really excited about."

Jeremy and Molly are both Chattanooga natives. Jeremy graduated from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, with an economics degree and a minor in commercial recreation, while Molly has an RN degree from UT, Chattanooga.

The couple has three sons: Jackson, Colton and Landon.

They started Camp Big Fish 12 years ago in Ooltewah with only 40 campers, and over the years branched out to 10 locations, including Knoxville and Nashville, where they have ministered to and cared for more than 1,400 campers who have attended either the summer

camp or their after-school care, Big Fish ministry.

"We partner with churches and schools for nine to 10 weeks during the summer and also provide after school care at different locations during the year," said Jeremy, who noted Camp Big Fish is also offering summer camp services at Christian Academy of Knoxville this year, but is close to capacity at that site.

Jeremy said the large number of campers allows them to remain in the same age group range.

"We break it down by age groups, and kids are typically just with their age groups," he added. "Many camps don't offer that.

"If kids go into it, knowing they will be with their friends, it is a big confidence builder."

Jeremy said their staff members are long-time employees, too.

"It's kind of unheard of, but most of our staff has been with us over three, four or even five years," he said. "It just shows how Camp Big Fish is fun for staff, too."

Having a nurse on staff "has been a huge help, especially last year," Jeremy said of his wife. "We followed CDC guidelines from the very beginning and were able to hold limited programs even last summer."

Camp runs through Friday, Aug. 6, and is only closed July 2.





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

Prevent dehydration during the dog days of summer

A person's desire to be outdoors can sometimes be at odds with the outdoors itself. The dead of winter tends to be a time of year when people know to stay indoors, but the dog days of summer can be dangerous as well.

Heat-related diseases like dehydration can put lives at risk. According to Johns Hopkins Medicine, children and people over the age of 60 are particularly susceptible to dehydration. Understanding dehydration and how to prevent it is essential for anyone who plans to spend time outside during the summer.

What is dehydration?

The U.S. National Library of Medicine notes that a dehydrated body does not have enough fluid and electrolytes to work properly. On an average day, the human body needs about three quarts of water. But the USNLM notes that anvone planning to spend time outside in the hot sun needs significantly more water than that to avoid dehydration.

What are the signs of dehydration?

Johns Hopkins Medicine notes that people experience dehydration differently. However, there are some common symptoms that indicate someone is dehydrated. These symptoms include:

- less frequent urination,
- · dry skin,
- · fatigue,

- light-headedness.
- · dizziness,
- · confusion, and
- · dry mouth and mucous membranes,
- · increased heart rate and breathing.

Children who are dehydrated may exhibit additional symptoms, including dry mouth and tongue; no tears and crying; no wet diapers for several hours; sunken abdomen, eyes or cheeks; listlessness; irritability; and skin that does not flatten when pinched and released.

How to prevent dehydration

Drinking plenty of fluids when working or playing in the sun is one way to prevent dehydration. Being sure to take in more fluid than you are losing is another way to prevent dehydration. Anyone, and especially people who sweat a lot, should keep a close eye on fluid loss when spending time outdoors in the summer. Sports drinks that help people maintain their electrolyte balance, such as Gatorade, can help prevent dehy dration as well. Pedialyte is often recommended for sick infants or children who have experienced vomiting, as it can help restore electrolyte balance that was adversely affected when kids became sick. The solution can be equally effective at restoring electrolyte balance that was thrown off during heat exposure.

Dehydration poses a significant health risk at any time of year, but people who spend time out in the summer heat may be especially vulnerable. Limiting time spent outdoors on hot days and keeping a close eye on your fluid intake and fluid levels can help prevent dehydration.

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Tips for family camping trips

- Let kids help when choosing camping equipment. Youngsters may be more excited about camping if they're allowed to choose certain equipment, including their sleeping bags and tents. Before visiting your nearby camping retailer, explain to kids that tents come in various styles because they're designed to protect campers from certain elements that may be more common in certain areas than others. Such an explanation can make it easy to explain to youngsters why you're purchasing certain items, even if those items weren't kids' top choices.
- Plan the family menu in advance. Plan the menu in advance so you can ensure everyone will continue to eat healthy. But make sure to include a few kid-friendly camping classics, like s'mores, in the meal plan as well.
- Prepare a camping-friendly first-aid kit. Bandages and topical antibiotic creams are part and parcel of any first-aid kit, regardless of where you're going. But the elements pose a different set of challenges that require a more extensive first-aid kit. When designing a first-aid kit for your camping trip, be sure to include all the usual items but also over-the-counter medications that can treat pain, allergies, constipation, and diarrhea. An extra gallon or two of water also makes for a wise addition to campers' firstaid kits.

Family camping trips can instill a lifelong love of the great outdoors in youngsters. A few simple strategies can help parents make such trips safe and memorable.
