

Morning Pointe of Hardin Valley resident veteran takes flight to DC

A ir Force veteran Don Mills recently joined more than 100 East Tennessee veterans, Wednesday, April 12, on HonorAir Knoxville Flight 32 to Washington, D.C., to visit the war memorials.

Leaving Knoxville, Mills' family and members of the Morning Pointe of Hardin Valley staff joined the throngs of supporters with signs and encouragement for him.

"It was wonderful," said Mills, 89, a resident at Morning Pointe of Hardin Valley. He traveled with his son-in-law, Steve Vandergriff.

"He pushed me all over Washington in a wheelchair," Mills said about his son-in-law.

"He loved it," Mills' daughter, Catherine Vandergriff, said about her husband's experience in Washington.

The flight left at 9 a.m. from Tyson McGhee Airport and returned in the evening to a large welcome-home celebration. More than 130 veterans traveled on the flight to tour the World War II, Korean War and Vietnam War memorials, among others.

"I liked all the different memorials – they are all very nice," Mills said. However, one memorial that stood out, for him was the U.S. Marine Corps. Memorial had special meaning for Mills.

"They had all the guys raising the flag on Iwo Jima," he said. "They had it in a bronze statue."

Of seven brothers and two sisters, "I had six older brothers that were in the Marines," Mills shared. "They all served in World War II in the Pacific campaign. They all saw combat, but they all came home without



being wounded.

"Two brothers landed on Guadecanal," he recalled.
"They all encouraged me not to go into the Marines, so
I went into the Air National Guard [precursor to the Air
Forcel."

Mills served from 1952-56. When he enlisted, he already had his pilot's license, which he earned at age 16.

Mills said he wanted to be a cadet but didn't pass the physical. During his service, he was a mechanic and then a flight engineer. At one point, he held a record for fastest solo flight, at three hours and 15 minutes.

"He was stationed in Japan," his daughter, Catherine Vandergriff, said. "They had a baseball team. He was the pitcher for the Air Force baseball team in Ashiyamachi (or Ashiya Beach in English).

"On the southern island," Mills said, adding he also went to Korea, changing an engine on a C-47, but did not see combat action.

During his Air Force career, he was stationed in San Antonio and Wichita Falls, Texas, as well as Maxwell Field in Montgomery, Alabama, where he met his wife, Sarah, who worked at the base. They had four children — Chuck Mills, Tricia Baehr, Catherine and Andy Mills, who all attended Farragut schools. Mills also has six grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

Mills, who grew up in Knoxville, was discharged from the Air Force after four years of service as a staff sergeant.

"We moved to Farragut in 1967, Catherine said.



want to be successful."

Reflecting on his career

Asked to name the two best pitchers he faced, Dawson listed four, then said, "probably the two best were Bruce Sutter (reliever, St. Louis) and Nolan Ryan (starter, N.Y. Mets, Texas Rangers, Houston Astros).

With Ryan known for throwing one of the most lethal fastballs in MLB history, "I always liked the challenges of the power guys like a Nolan Ryan because it's strength-against-strength," Dawson said.

"He had a tendency to be intimidating, but I would never let a pitcher intimidate me," the Hall of Famer added. "I would go out there knowing it was going to be a battle."

Asked if he could sum up his career in one word, Dawson — after hesitating a few seconds — said "painful."


"I had 12 knee operations," added Dawson, a funeral home owner in Miami. "I was like every year there was some form of rehab."

He then had second thoughts choosing "painful," wanting to emphasize that baseball "is the game that I love and the only thing I ever wanted to do" $^{\circ}$

About changes in MLB, "I'm glad they're doing away with the shift," Dawson said about a rule that no longer allows infielders to shift beyond the general area of their natural position when facing certain hitters.

"I think that's going to bring more offense to the game," he added.

Overall, "I'd like to see the game more catered to the youth because that's where the game should be," Dawson said.

With summer just around the corner, guests at Topgolf can now enjoy some limited-time drink options, such as a frozen pina colada and nonalcoholic mango cooler, and sign up to participate in seasonal leagues.

Summer Academy, a week-long program for children ages six through 12, will also be held at five different times throughout the summer. Grenier said this program teaches everything needed to get started in golf.

"We teach them about golf and we feed them, and they have a lot of fun – it's kind of like a kid's camp for Topgolf," he said.

In addition to the Summer Academy, Topgolf offers individual and group lessons and public classes throughout the year. Parties, fundraisers and other events can also be held at the venue.

"We can accommodate pretty much any size of a party," said Grenier,

noting that the largest party hosted so far consisted of more than 500 people. "There are several different options depending on how many people you have and the different types of food options you're looking for."

Celebrating 15 years of Hardin Valley Academy

By Alan Sloan

There were 60 teachers and about 1,200 students at the opening of Hardin Valley Academy in August 2008 — with a freshman-through-junior enrollment that first school year.

Fifteen years later, the school's faculty has more than doubled, while HVA's academic achievements rival Farragut and Bearden high schools for the best among Knox County Schools.

Student enrollment annually goes beyond 2,000, rivaling Bearden annually for the largest among all county high schools.

Interesting beginnings

Guiding HVA through its first 11 years was principal Sallee Reynolds, who had been the principal at Knoxville West High for roughly three-and-a-half years when then Knox County Schools superintendent

Charles Lindsey "asked if I would be willing to serve as principal of the new 'northwest high school'" in early February 2007, she recalled.

After "thinking about it about a week-and-a-half," Reynolds decided to accept the offer, which came on Valentine's Day of 2007.

For the remainder of the 2006-07 school year, Reynolds found herself splitting her duties between West and what would become HVA.

Knox County Public Building Authority "was given the responsibility of building that school," Reynolds said, adding there was "a great working relationship" with KCPBA, Merit Construction Co. and Lewis Architect Group.

As for key figures from KCS fondly remembered, "Russ Oaks, he was in the (public relations) role at that time. He was very supportive and helped with a lot of things," Reynolds said.

George Ashe, then a British literature teacher and varsity boys soccer head coach at West, joined Reynolds in July 2007 as a assistant principal.

"We were in a position to kind of chart our course," said Ashe, who also became HVA athletic director and STEM Academy principal.

"George and I were a committee of two," Reynolds said. "We made decisions about furniture, we made decisions about what type of technology.

"With the exception of the soft seating in the library, we chose every stick of furniture in this building," she added. "... Colors of the door, colors of the brick, color of the floor, color of the walls. All of these decisions were made by us."

Moreover, saying she was inspired by observing a beautiful blue sky while on vacation, Reynolds decided the school colors would be powder blue and Navy blue.

Shortages

Because funds had been exhausted in construction costs and furniture, "We didn't have all the textbooks we needed," Ashe said. "We had state-of-the-art chemistry and biology labs, but no glassware."

In athletics, "We had the fields, but we didn't have anything to cut them with," he said about a lack of mowing equipment. "There was no equipment in the budget."

Such items were among those "that should have been in the budget, but weren't thought of," Ashe said. "They just slipped people's minds."

As a result, "We were calling friends at all of our (Knox County) Schools and saying, 'hey, do you have any extra textbooks? Do you have some extra glassware? Do you have some extra whatever?" Ashe recalled.

"And they were most gracious; they would help us out," he added. "I would drive over XZY school and pick up a whole box-load of glassware."

"... When we started this (football) program, we didn't even have a football that was ours; we had to borrow some to go out and practice," said Wes Jones, the Hawks' first varsity football head coach who also served as a driver's education teacher at the school.

Zoning issues

"There was a lot of contention about who came to this school,"



Reynolds said. "Everybody wanted a new school in northwest Knoxville to help relieve overcrowding.

"But it was for everybody else's kids and not there's," she added.
"This was a school nobody wanted their children to come to. ... Parents immediately thought, 'You mean when my child's in the eighth grade they've got to decide what they want to be when they grow up?"

Answering that misunderstanding, "That's not at all what an academy is about," Reynolds said.

However, that parent mentality "lasted until they made the decision, seems like it was around November 2007: 'this is who is coming, this is the zone, period,'" the school's first principal recalled. "It was kind of like people said, OK. ... It settled down and we moved forward.

"We got parent groups involved immediately," she added.

HVA to Vandy success story

With No Child Left Behind guidelines in place during the first HVA school year of 2008-09, "We had kids coming from everywhere in this district — it wasn't just those who were zoned — because we had so much space," Reynolds said. "We had kids who were being transported from all parts of the county. Just about anybody who applied for a transfer got it, that first year, because of the room that we had."

One such student "was hanging with the wrong group (at his previous school), wasn't being challenged," Reynolds said. "From where he started as a freshman, (that school) pretty much didn't have much hope for him going to college. ... He had a rough freshman year.

"Came over here (as a sophomore) and struggled for maybe the first

month," she added.

However, not only did this student

graduate from HVA, "He was our first kid to be accepted by Vanderbilt," Reynolds said. "... He had a few teachers challenge him. "He really decided learning is something special."

Such a special atmosphere at HVA is soon to be, at the end of the 2022-23 school year, a 15-year tradition.

Annually one of the top FIRST Robotics teams in Tennessee — and some years well beyond the Volunteer State borders — Hardin Valley Academy's RoHAWK-tics Team 3824 swept the playoffs to become 2022 Smoky Mountain Regional Competition winners at the event, which ended Saturday, April 2. The team, holding the coveted blue banner, also won the Entrepreneurship Award, its second this season. It was one of three teams competing in SMRC that headed to the FIRST Robotics World Championship April 20-23 in Houston, Texas.



meets, followed by Aaron Templeton the next two years, 2012 and

Aaron also added the 3200 run state championship in 2014.

A pair of girls wrestlers are responsible for more than 25 percent of the individual haul — while both achieved perfection in the process: Kenya Sloan was a four-time undefeated state champ (in the 165-weight class in 2015, then at 160 the following three years).

Having brought home three state titles without losing is HVA junior Ella Murphey, winning at 190 in 2021 as an unbeaten freshman, then capturing the state crown at 185 the past two seasons.

Throwing success in field events earned Tamia Crockett four state championships: 2013 in both discus and shot put, while repeating in the same events in 2015.

Jumping success was the field event accomplishment of Weldon Wright in 2015, winning both the long jump and triple jump.

Lady Hawk Sidnee Shelton went back-to-back in the state triple jump, earning top honors in 2021 and 2022.

Other HVA individual state titles

Emily Yarnell was 100-meter dash champ in 2011, while Ashley Kessler earned the pole vault state crown in 2012; Ben McCay rose to the top in pole vault as 2013 state champion; Liza El-Ajam won shot put top honors in 2014, as did Emma Mashburn in the 3200 run that same year.

Three HVA runners captured top state honors in 2018: Willington Wright in the 400 run, Ellie Bachmann in the 800 run and boys 4 X 400 relay team.





Fighting food scarcity

Holbert earns a prestigious Girl Scouts' award

After witnessing people in Mexico dig through trash to feed their families, Danielle Holbert is doing whatever she can to fight food scarcity in the Knoxville community.

"I went on a lot of mission trips, and once when I was in Tijuana, we fed people in a dump who lived there," she explained. "They had houses built out of trash and were collecting aluminum cans and walked about a mile away to sell them for pesos."

In response to this experience, the recent Tennessee Connections Academy graduate has built and placed a blessing box at Riverview Baptist Church to help serve local families in need.

"It's a low-income community and there are homeless families throughout the area," she said.

Holbert routinely stocks the blessing box with a variety of canned and boxed food items, diapers and hygienic products. She also likes to fill it with special items like coloring books, cards and stuffed animals for holidays.

"Every once in a while, I'll put a birthday bag in there, which contains cake mix, party favors and all that stuff you need for a birthday party," she added.

The project has earned Holbert the Girl Scouts' prestigious Gold Award, the organization's highest achievement that's given to those who drive lasting change by tackling issues they are passionate about.

While it's often easy to become disillusioned with the future of the world, Holbert, who's been a Girl Scout since she was just a Daisy, noted that it's important to realize that "there are still good people out there."

"With the younger generation having such a bad outlook on things, I want people to know that there are people who still care about the way things roll around here," she said. "The community needs to know that there is hope. I've met multiple people who are either trying to do the same mission as me or trying to do something else to help the community."

Leadership change at HVA

A few days following a gas leak at Hardin Valley Academy — as experienced by students, faculty, administrators and other employees for a few hours before school was dismissed in the early afternoon of Thursday, March 30 — HVA principal Dr. Rob Speas was placed on administrative leave.

Allegedly turned on purposely by a now-fired custodial employee overnight (Jay Riley Kostermans, 23), the leak energized detractors of the school's leadership — also including criticism of Knox County Schools administrators and elected officials — while supporters of Speas also expressed themselves, starting a petition to save his job.

Meanwhile, new leadership took charge Monday, April 10.

Michael Reynolds, a former principal and Farragut, Fulton and Knoxville Central high schools, came out of retirement to assume the role of interim principal pending Speas' status.



Love of language leads to adventure

HVA student Brown to study in Taiwan

Hardin Valley Academy junior Samson Brown, 17, will live in Taiwan this summer, compliments of a full scholarship through the U.S. Department of State's National Security Language Initiative.

"I was really excited," he recalled about hearing the news he received the scholarship.



"I think, originally, I didn't actually have much faith in it because all the kids who do get this scholarship are going to Ivy League schools.

"I found out I made it, and I thought, 'Man, this is really happening!'

"I can't help but be excited," Brown said. "I'm going to embrace the opportunity."

He will leave for Taiwan June 21 and return to Knoxville Aug. 9.

Brown was encouraged to apply for the scholarship by his friend, HVA salutatorian Eli Johnson, who took a similar trip last year, and HVA's Chinese language teacher, Dr. Frank Chen.

While he applied in November 2022, he thought his chances of being chosen for the trip were "as shot in the dark.

"I remember finishing my application a day before it was due," Brown said. I was stressing about it ... I never thought this was going to happen."

The next step was a Zoom call interview, which he thought he did well.

The son of Dan and Keri Brown, Brown has been taking Chinese language courses

at HVA since his freshman year.

Now in Advanced Placement Chinese class, he said he hopes this immersive experience will improve his Mandarin language skills.

"I'm just really interested in language because I've always wanted to travel," Brown said. "I kind of felt like studying language would be like a gateway.

"Also, the Chinese program here at HVA is really good," he added, "Dr. Chen is a really good teacher, and my class is like a family. There are only seven people in my AP Chinese

Besides the NSLI trip, Brown also plans to take a separate class trip to Taiwan for students in HVA's Chinese program from May 28 to June 12 before embarks on his NSLI trip.

While in Taiwan, he will take four hours of language classes and one hour of culture class a day at the Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages in Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

Brown observed Taiwan, like America, is like a "melting pot" of various cultures.

"It was controlled by Japan at one point and then China," he said. "Now, it is its own independent country."

Brown looks forward to eating the local foods, such as fried noodles (chow mein), dumplings (jiaozi) and hotpot, since Asian cuisine has been a longtime favorite of Brown and his father.

"Whatever they feed me over there, I'm going to eat it," added, laughing.

Brown will spend the first two weeks of his trip living with a

host family then he will live in the university's dorms. He will learn who the host family is two weeks before he leaves for Taiwan.

"I can't wait to be part of a host family and maybe have a little sibling from across the world," Brown said.

He initially became interested in learning languages through his grandparent's travels. "They traveled almost everywhere, all over the world," Brown said. "I might have seen learning a language as a gateway to traveling and exploring."

His first experience with the travel bug was when his grandparents took him on their trips to places, such as Washington, D.C.; North and South Dakotas; Wyoming and Montana.

Brown said he might consider a full academic year in Taiwan through NSLI.

"I want to continue to study Chinese and East Asian studies when I go to college," he said, adding his immediate plans after graduating high school are to attend the University of Tennessee and major in business.

"I may couple that with international affairs or international business, ultimately become a diplomat," Brown said.

Summer camp season will soon be here, and throngs of children will board buses each morning or pack their parents' cars full of essentials to survive a few weeks away from home.

Looking back, many adults who experienced summer camp have fond memories of their adventures — whether they all went according to plan or there were some hiccups along the way. Parents want their children to make their own summer camp memories. Even if the canoe capsizes or the cabin leaks during a summer thunderstorm, such experiences can build character and strengthen friendships.

According to RegPack, an online registration software company, more than six million American children participate in some form of camp each year, including sleep-away camp or day camp. The American Camp Association says that number is closer to 14 million, with the most popular camp session length around one week or less. Families getting prepared for camp can follow these guidelines to ensure the experience is one kids won't soon forget.

Consider children's readiness

There's no magic age when a child may be ready to go to camp, but generally kids who are ages seven or eight may be fine to start a resident sleepaway camp. Day camp kids can begin as early as age three, the same age kids often begin preschool programs. Gauge whether the child has spent time away from home at friends' or family members' homes to decide if a resident camp will be the right fit or if a day camp is more appropriate.

Connect with fellow campers

If possible, attend a meet-and-greet prior to the start of the season. Neighborhood day camps tend to draw kids from local communities, so there's already a chance kids will know a few fellow campers.

Get to know camp counselors early on

Campers can introduce themselves to camp counselors and other program directors and are urged to ask questions about specific programs. Counselors can direct campers toward activities they may enjoy.

• Make the most of all situations Much of summer camp will likely be smooth-sailing, but it's reasonable to expect some bumps along the way. Campers shouldn't expect perfection, but use the situations that may go awry as learning experiences on how to handle adversity — trying to find the fun in them anyway. Even a medical situation can be overcome, particularly because camps staff qualified medical personnel to ensure campers are safe and well.




