Farragut High School Class of 2024 seniors, 530, walked the stage for the school's Commencement Ceremony on Bill Clabo Field Sunday, May 19, to receive their diplomas with the challenge to "make a difference" still ringing in their ears.

This tribute is being displayed for public viewing in

the showroom of Rusty Wallace Nissan, 4515 Clinton Highway in Knoxville, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., daily, through Memorial Day, Monday, May 27.

"Unlike brick-and-mortar memorials, Salute to Tennessee's Fallen is designed to travel and includes military and civilian photographs of the individuals, their hometown, their rank and branch of service and

the date and place of their death. This memorial is available to be exhibited across Tennessee," Albrecht stated in the release.

"Its legacy will be that these men and women will be remembered, and their names will be spoken, while helping to lessen the grief of their families," he added.

Homeowners willing to fight 'front yard' greenway path

Planning Commission delays action after hearing residents' concerns

After hearing concerns by residents, Farragut Municipal Planning Commission voted unanimously to defer approval of preliminary design plans for the proposed Turkey Creek Greenway extension to the abutting portions of Turkey Creek Road during the FMPC meeting Thursday, May 16.

"It sounds like, from an engineering point of view, (the plans are) OK, but it looks like there are some issues to be resolved before we really want to recommend approval to Board of Mayor and Aldermen," Planning Commissioner Jon Greene said.

"I definitely have some real concerns," Planning Commissioner Jeff Devlin said. "I'd love to extend the greenway, but there are some pretty significant issues out there."

The proposed preliminary plan shows an extension of Turkey Creek Greenway from the current western terminus on the west side of Brixworth subdivision to Sheffield subdivision and Virtue Road and improvements along Turkey Creek Road.

"The project will include nominal widening of Turkey Creek Road — approximately 3 feet — and add curb and gutter along the north side of the roadway," Town engineer Darryl Smith said. "We anticipate six properties will be affected."

"Upon completion, the Turkey Creek Greenway will be connected by sidewalk through Sheffield subdivision to the Little Turkey

Harkins outspoken to stop greenway path; Neal to handle any legal issues

Shirley Harkins is one outspoken homeowner, among a handful, fighting a Town staff-recommended Turkey Creek Road Greenway extension planned to go through their front yards and take about 25 feet across.

If carried out as planned, her home and others alongside Turkey Creek Road just east of this road's intersection with Virtue Road will "absolutely, without question" lose value due to factors including esthetics, with the extension to include "ugly" retaining walls, she said.

"There's six property owners that the trail would cross ... and we are adamantly opposed to it for a number of reasons," Harkins added.

About the greenway extension being before Farragut Municipal Planning Commission during its Thursday, May 16, meeting (see related story), "It was interesting that they had it. It was the first time on the agenda, and it was just straight out to be approved (and sent to Board of Mayor and Aldermen), period," she said, as FMPC delayed action as a handful

Creek Greenway, which was completed earlier this year," he added.

"Future improvements to Virtue Road will include a greenway connection from the bridge over Little Turkey Creek to the Grove at Boyd Station, which will be connected along Boyd Station Road to McFee Road."

FMPC, residents make points: Vision Plan for Town Center

While appreciating the work put into the Town's Vision Plan for the Mixed-Use Town Center, Farragut Municipal Planning Commission questioned some of the elements of the plan.

FMPC took no action on the plan but did relay opinions, as did a handful of residents.

Among the features in the plan were raised medians along Kingston Pike and roundabouts, as well as signal lights at each end of Jamestowne Boulevard.

"I'm not crazy (about the medians in Kingston Pike's center lane) either," FMPC chairman Scott Russ said.

"It looks pretty on paper," vice chairman Ed St. Clair said.

"Let's be careful," said Vice Mayor Louise

Povlin, also an FMPC member. "We are not doing a road diet."

"If we can cut down on the stacking issue," St. Clair said. "That's a major problem."

"Certainly islands on a state highway could have the potential of being an issue," Commissioner Jeff Devlin said.

"Certainly, medians ... do serve some purpose on certain roads," resident Evan Lohrey said. "Grigsby Chapel Road is one of those roads that it has served its purpose."

However, "my fear is ones I saw proposed (on the vision plan) on Kingston Pike," he added. "It is a Tennessee highway ... it's always going to be served in that way ... especially if there is an issue on the Interstates."

He reminded FMPC the center lane is used by emergency vehicles, such as the fire department.

"I think it's a great plan in a lot of ways," resident Mike Mitchell said. However, he said there are issues with the transportation component.

“One of the issues that concerns me the most is the turning radius,” he added, noting it is not big enough at Kingston Pike and Campbell Station Road.

“I don’t think a lot of people have seen this (document),” Mitchell said.

“We have been looking at our Comprehensive Land Use Plan for the past several years,” Community Development Director Mark Shipley said.

“We actively use the plan in this community, which is a good thing. It’s a living document that guides us ... we want

it to be current and flexible,” he added.

“So, when we got to the Mixed Use Town Center priority area, given the historic importance of having a downtown, which ... has been a goal since the Town was founded, we felt like this particular priority area might be a good one for outside consultants to come in and work with the community.”

The Town hired a consultant and held numerous public meetings, inviting the public to participate. The end result was a draft plan for Board of Mayor and Aldermen’s consideration.

“They looked at street-scaping elements — adding street trees — outdoor gathering spaces, looking at residential scales — townhomes were the top preferred residential scale,” Shipley said. “As far as commercial, the two-story was the top choice, as far as scale for Mixed Use Town Center.”

heart “to fix it.”

Bartlett announced FHS’s graduates earned \$43 million in scholarships, while five grads have committed to join the military.

“There is no greater calling than to serve your country,” added Bartlett, himself a former U.S. Marine.

Commencement speakers Audrey Loudon and Michelle Lin took from the class quote by Jane Goodall: “What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide what difference you want to make,” offering a similar challenge.

“Jane Goodall understood everything we do makes a difference, even the decision to do nothing at all,” Loudon said. “The future you have can make a difference. What kind of difference is up to you.”

“Our greatest freedom is to react,” Lin said. “What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide the difference you want to make.”

KCSO reports

• **At 1:33 p.m., Sunday, May 12, Knox County Sheriff’s Office units were dispatched to 11220 Outlet Drive at Cotton Eyed Joe about a suspect causing a disturbance.** “Details of the call pertained to a female buying an underage female alcohol,” the report stated.

“As I arrived at the Cotton Eyed Joe, I observed a female matching the description of the suspect walking eastbound on Outlet Drive. As I went to make contact with her, the suspect who was later identified ..., immediately began to yell at me, (saying) “take me to jail mother f—,” the report further stated.

Suspect “showed obvious signs of intoxication, as she had slurred speech, was extremely unsteady on her feet and had a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from her breath and person,” the report stated. Suspect said she was “walking away from the Cotton Eyed Joe, and that she did not buy alcohol for a minor.

“At this time (suspect’s) behavior continued to be disrespectful toward me and other officers, to the point of making racial slurs toward an officer on the scene who was Hispanic, calling him a b——, and that she hoped he and all b—— die,” the report further stated.

“Due to my belief that (suspect) is a danger to herself and others, she was placed under custody for public intoxication. She was transported to the detention facility. Officers attempted to look for the underage female that (suspect) was supposedly selling alcohol to, but were unsuccessful in locating her.”

• **At 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, May 8, a KCSO unit “responded to 11340 Campbell Lakes Drive (Hampton Inn) in reference to a disturbance/unwanted guest,”** the report stated. “My body-worn camera was used on this call. The details are as follows: upon arrival, I contacted the complainant ...,” who “stated a guest of the hotel for the past four days ... was asked to leave numerous times and refused. Suspect “was removed from the vehicle and placed into handcuffs,” the report further stated. “I advised he was under arrest for public intoxication and trespassing.” Suspect’s vehicle was towed upon request of Hampton Inn and removed by Sutherland Towing.

“Based on the above investigation, I found probable cause to charge (suspect) with public intoxication, as he appeared in a public place under the influence and trespassing as he remained on the property after being asked to leave numerous times,” the report further stated. “I deemed (suspect) a danger to himself and the public due to his impairment and unlikeliness to be able to care for himself.”

He was transported to the Roger D. Wilson Detention Facility without further incident.

• **At 3:36 p.m., Tuesday, May 6, officers responded to a Sonja Drive residence in response to a hit-and-run property damage.** Victim/property owner said sometime between the hours of 6:30 p.m., Monday, May 5, and 6 a.m. earlier that day, someone drove through her lawn and destroyed her driveway wall.

“Officers witnessed tire marks looking to be like vehicle tire marks going through one part of her lawn and down a concrete wall into a driveway and across the second part of her lawn,” the report stated.

Jason Elliott, principal engineer with LVA Engineering in Alcoa, said the trail would be extended 1/3 of a mile. "There are quite a few retaining walls along the greenway," he added.

Residents sound off

With that, Dustin Anderson, who has property along the proposed extension, voiced his concerns about the greenway crossing his driveway, as well as the retaining walls.

Anderson said motorists driving along Turkey Creek Road see a nice yard — but once the retaining walls are

built in front of his property, "all you see are walls.

"It's going to be a big financial burden for me to get water and sewer," he added.

Additionally, Anderson said the greenway going across his driveway would cause the driveway to become too steep, making it dangerous during inclement weather.

While Elliott noted "a slight increase" in slope, John Neal, an attorney who represents three families opposed to the extension through their front yards, contended the slope is too steep.

Planning Commissioner Noah Myers suggested Anderson talk with his neighbor and have a shared driveway

that could reduce the slope for both residents.

"We could look at that (solution) if both residents agree," Elliott said.

Anderson also warned his property maybe illegally subdivided. "It shows two separate parcels," he added.

"We can't purchase the right-of-way until we know (that status)," said Vice Mayor Louise Povlin, who also is an FMPC member.

"I think there are some serious practical issues," Neal said.

"All the folks affected by (the extension) strongly oppose it," he added, warning of impending litigation because of "contractual relationship between

one of the residents, David Galbraith, and the Town."

"In 2005, you gave your word (the property would not change)," said Janet Galbraith, who represented David Galbraith, her father.

"And your attorney, Tom Hale, has a conflict of interest," said Neal, who added Hale represents a family who also is involved.

Steve Williams, a Virtue Road resident, objected to widening Virtue Road, as motorists already use the road as a "race track."

He also objected to extending the greenway at Virtue Road, noting the Town has no security and the speeding he said takes place.

of citizens spoke against the extension.

"The only way that we knew what occurred at the meeting was because of Tammy Cheek's article (May 17, 2023, in farragutpress)," added Harkins, who along with two other families has hired Bearden attorney John Neal.

"We didn't find that out until the summer, when in June, when I decided that maybe I should look at the archives of the newspaper just to see what I had missed and what was going on in the Town. And so when I looked at the archives and I saw the article that she wrote, it was shocking because we knew nothing about anything being planned."

"But I'm not against greenways as a concept," she said.

Neal said he also represents David Galbraith and Howard and Bobbie Tipton, also along the north side of Turkey Creek Road near Virtue. "Let's just say that they are really displeased about having 25 feet of their front yards come off," Neal said. "Of course, they're all extremely opposed to the project."

Though Jason Elliott, prin-

cipal engineer with LVA Engineering in Alcoa, noted "a slight increase" in driveway slope angle at the meeting, "I've been out there and stood in their driveways and looked, and I'm convinced it's going to make their driveways so steep that, for instance, in snow and ice, it's going to be just impossible to get in and out," Neal added. "It's certainly impossible to go down and check mail."

Legally, "There's two or three issues," Neal said.

Back in 2005, "When Mr. Galbraith sold property for Sheffield subdivision, there

was a request that there be a waiver of the Town requirement for a sidewalk in front of his house," he said. "When the Sheffield subdivision was approved, staff recommended that the city deny that request and the Town insist on a sidewalk. But instead, the Town decided against the sidewalk.

"... I think there's a contract between Mr. Galbraith and the Town, and he'd be entitled to an injunction if they try to build something in front of his house because i would be a breached contract," Neal added.

As for value considerations, "The Town's argument will

be that having a greenway in front of their houses will actually raise the value," Neal said. "... Well, the Town admits these cuts that they're going to have to make are deep enough that they're going to have to put retaining walls all along."

To pay for the extension, "when they started it out (in the 2022 fiscal year budget), it was budgeted at \$370,000. Now, it's budgeted at \$2,500,000 ... for 1,782 feet of sidewalk because this isn't really a greenway, this is sidewalk," Neal said.

Harkins said the \$370,000 included a greenway section, as part of an extension option

that was rejected, that would have added a section going as far north as Sheffield subdivision's clubhouse. Yet without that, it's still \$2.5 million as of the FY 2024 budget.

About FMPC delaying action, "I think that was the right decision because there are significant legal issues that need to be ironed out," Neal said. "Because the Town attorney (Tom Hale) has a conflict, they're going to have to go find a lawyer and get an opinion from that lawyer as to whether he agrees with me that there's a problem or not."

HARDIN VALLEY — In evaluating the outstanding boys soccer seasons for Bearden and Hardin Valley Academy in head-to-head showdowns and both teams' do-or-die Sectional battles, the visitors proved to be road warriors each time.

After Ryan Radcliffe's SoccerDawgs answered a Hawks penalty kick walkoff celebration at BHS during the regular season with a 3-1 District 4-3A Tournament victory at HVA, it was Hardin Valley answer-

ing back at Bearden's Turner-Allender Field with a 1-0 Region 2-3A tourney title win Thursday, May 16.

Looking back over the years, Hart said William Michael Shaffer and Braden Salsbury most inspired him.

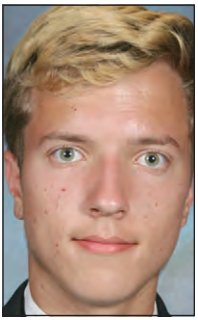

news she was chosen.

“I had no idea that I was even in the running, so I was not expecting it at all,” she said. “I still cannot believe it.” For Stewart, being chosen as one of the valedictorians means “that you can surprise yourself and do anything as long as you put your mind to it and try.”

“It means more than anything to be chosen, and it reminds me that even though it can be tough, there is always light at the end of the tunnel if you just keep going and don’t give up,” she added.

At HVA, Stewart was involved in the Student Council executive board, National Honors Society and HOSA. She also is part of the clinical internship program.

Last year Stewart was in FCCLA, as well, and volunteered as a soccer coach for 5- to 8-year-old girls for two seasons through AYSO.

Outside of clubs, she works about 25 hours a week in retail.

Stewart has earned the Class of 2024 Excellence in English Award, Excellence in Science Award, Pythagoras Excellence in Honors Algebra 2, Pythagoras Excellence in SDC Pre-Calculus, Health Science Academy Student of the Month and Health Science Academy Award.

“My career goal is to be a nurse practitioner,” Stewart said. “I love helping people and want to provide them comfort and light during their tough times.”

“I have also experienced a lot of health issues that led to feeling poorly and frustration in trying to find the answers,” she added. “I want to help people who are in the same boat that I once was in and show them that they are not alone.”

“After experiencing all my health issues and seeing my family and friends also have some, I became curious about

how the human body works and what happens to cause the health problems we have experienced.”

Specifically, “I want to help diagnose people and decide treatment plans, but I don’t want to go through as much schooling as doctors have to. So, with all of that in mind, I landed on my goal of becoming a nurse practitioner,” Stewart said.

As such, “After high school, I plan to attend the University of Tennessee at Knoxville under the nursing major,” she said. “After that, I hope to continue my education in a nurse practitioner graduate program.”

Looking back at HVA, “It was definitely tough, but I had a lot of great times as well,” Stewart said.

“I think a key part of getting through high school is having people around you who help you succeed,” she added. “I have friends that push me to keep going when I want to give up, who help me study and answer any questions I may have, who give me confidence when

I am nervous about a test and are there for anything I may need.

“My best friend, in particular, played a big role in helping me find my path, supporting me through thick and thin and constantly encouraging me.”

Not to be left out, “I also had a few teachers and a counselor who always offered to help and constantly reminded me that I am stronger and smarter than I realize,” she said. “I guess those people are my inspiration in a way because I never would have ended up where I am without them.”

Daniel recalled he was “extremely happy to have earned this honor.”

“It means I worked hard throughout high school, and I’m proud to be recognized by my school for my hard work,” added the son of BJ and Amy Daniel.

He plans to attend Northeastern University and major in computer science and business administration.

Looking back at his years at HVA, Daniel said, “I think that high school is an important time in my life, but I hope that the next 20 amount to be infinitely more fun.”

Considering who inspired him the most, Daniel said his dad was his biggest inspiration.

father (Bob Morris) that night, and Rob said, 'Oh, by the way, you know why we don't have a baseball team?' And his father said, 'Why?' And he said, 'Well, because we don't have a field.'

"(The father) said, 'You do now.' ... He donated the money to put up fences and everything," Arnett added.

School officials accepted the gift and created a baseball program while choosing the first baseball field location (where Lee Athletic Center now sits).

"And if he hadn't been persistent, we wouldn't have had a team for another five years," Arnett said of Rob Morris.

About that first field, "You'd have to see our old ballpark because there was no fence. There was a big, huge uphill climb out in our outfield," said Kevin Kyle, a sophomore outfielder, infielder and pitcher in 1974 who's a commercial office furniture businessman in Atlanta. He also was at the ceremony.

As for the gathering, "I haven't seen hardly any of them in the last 45 years or so," said Rob Morris, a junior middle infielder/pitcher in 1974.

"I had not seen most of those guys in literally 45, 50 years," said Kyle, who has three children and five grandchildren.

A retired co-founder of Trust Company of Tennessee, Arnett recalled the first Webb baseball victory was

5-1 against Young High School (now South-Doyle).

"Bill Arbo homered and struck out 10 batters, pitching six innings," he said. Those Spartans ended the 1974 season with seven wins.

Named KIL Player of the Year in 1974 as a junior, Arbo's talent translated most distinctly to the next level among this bunch, going on to play wide receiver for the Tennessee Vols Football team. He also is a member of the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

While each player was introduced or recognized — along with three players who couldn't attend, and including the late Al Vesser (senior outfielder) and the program's first head coach, the late Don Tarvin — Rob Morris threw out the first pitch as Spartans Senior Night also was celebrated prior to a game versus Maryville.

Catching Rob's toss was

none other than his son, Brent Morris, also a former Spartans baseball player, Class of 2002.

Other team members on hand (with their year in school noted during that first season) were David Dickson (senior, co-captain), Dennis Ragsdale (senior, co-captain), sophomores Ross Baker and Hal Ernest, Jimmy Alexander (senior), Fred Ernest (sophomore), Dee Harrison (senior), Wade Sample (sophomore), Tim Schriver (freshman), Bo Townsend (representing the late Al Vesser) and juniors Mike Ayers and Eric Grigsby.

Unable to attend were senior Paul Sharp, junior Russ Breeding and sophomore Chris McMurry.

Also on hand carrying a 1974 Webb annual — and drawing a lot of 50-year baseball Spartans his way — was the Rev. Richard Paddon, school chaplain from 1970 to 1984.
